Passage Reading Genesis 1:1-31

LESSON CONCEPT:

 Acknowledging God as the Creator - God is Powerful.. Because He can do anything.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God creates this earth and its heaven and all forms of life in six days.
- The creation acts of each day are described—God creates man, both male and female, in His own image and likeness.
- Man is given dominion over all things and is commanded to multiply and fill the earth.

- What did God do in the beginning of the world?
- What did God create in today's story?
- What can we learn from today's Bible reading?
- Which Book did our story come from?
- What does this story mean to me?





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CREATION

Passage Reading Genesis 1:1-31

LIFE APPLICATION:

- You can ask them to locate certain creations by pointing out the verses
- When do you personally feel that God is your power? At school? At home? etc ...
- How can we show gratitude to our heavenly father?
- Can you have the courage to stand up for what is right? After all, look what God gave up for us.
- Which Book did our story come from?
- What does this story mean to me?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Do you know how many types of Angels God has created? We know 9 types that are mentioned in St Basil's Liturgy.
- Angels, Archangels, Principalities, Authorities, Thrones, Dominions, Powers, Cherubim & Seraphim.
- We all long for the day when we will go to Heaven and be part of all God's heavenly creation and praise His name forever.

"Therefore You are great, O Lord God. For there is none like You" (2 Samuel 7:22)

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

Passage Reading Genesis 3:1-24



LESSON CONCEPT:

• Obeying God's commandments will not make me fall.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The serpent deceives Eve to partake of the forbidden fruit, then Eve gave Adam to eat.
- The roles of man and woman are explained.
- Adam & Eve are cast out of the garden of Eden.
- Eve is the mother of all living.

- What is a commandment?
- What made Eve eat from the tree?
- What was the serpent trying to do to Eve? and Why?
- How did she feel when she ate from the tree?
- Can a person hide from God after disobeying God's commandments?







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Passage Reading Genesis 3:1-24

LIFE APPLICATION:

- When God tells us to do something or refrain from doing certain things, it is for our own good.
- We, Like Eve, can rationalize and start making excuses for not obeying God but we will always suffer for acting in such a way.
- He made us and he knows everything about us. He knows what is good for us.
- The tempter, the devil, is still working on the world today and he will tell the same lie he told Eve.
- He will tempt us to do exactly the opposite of what God wants for our own good.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- After the fall of Adam & Eve, the human nature got corrupted. Meaning that people were leaning to do evil and disobey God commandments.
- To fix this corrupted nature, the Church mandates that any believer must be first baptized to be declared a Christian. In the baptism we get a new nature that is leaning to do good and to obey God's commandments.

"Trust in the lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding" (Proverbs 3:5)



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Passage Reading Genesis 6:9 - 9:17




LESSON CONCEPT:

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How would you feel if you have to stay in house day after day without being able to go out because God told Noah that; will you listen to what God says.

"Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which He will accomplish for you today" (Exodus 14:13)



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
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Passage Reading Genesis 11:1-9

- Why did the people want to build a tower?
- Why did their efforts upset God?
- What was God's response?
- What does the tower represent in our lives now?
- Do we need high towers to be known to God?

Passage Reading Genesis 11:1-9

LIFE APPLICATION:

- We should not have an unhealthy pride.
- Good Pride is when you feel good about yourself because you have done a good job or you are part of something good that makes you feel happy.
- Bad Pride is when you think TOO well of yourself.
 You might think you are better than you really are if you have bad pride.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- When you go to visit an old monastery in Egypt, you find something common almost in all their very old churches.
- To enter to the church you have to bow down, as the church door is not that high; and this design had a purpose.
- This is to make you remember every time when you enter to the church that you have to humble yourself before the Lord and leave your pride out of the church boundaries.

A time of godly men presiding over the growing family. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph, successive generations of the same family, ruled over the Hebrew people in the earliest days of their existence.

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ABRAHAM

Passage Reading Genesis 12



LESSON CONCEPT:

• The honesty of God despite of our unfaithfulness

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God chose Abraham to be the beginning of a whole new nation that would be called God's people
- Abraham believed God & showed a true faith
- God asked Abraham to take his wife and relatives and to start traveling

- Who was Abraham's wife?
- Where was Abraham living when God told him to go to a new land?
- How many descendants did God say that Abraham would have?
- Did Abraham know where he was going when God told him to leave his home country?
- If you say "I have faith", but your life doesn't change; what kind of faith is it?



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ABRAHAM

Passage Reading Genesis 12

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Abraham was not a perfect man who did the right thing every single time but he continued to have a living faith in God. And God kept his promises to Abraham and protected him.
- Abraham had a living faith. He trusted in God and was willing to do what He said.
- Faith means believing something to be true even if you can't see it.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The first Sunday after Resurrection is called "Thomas Sunday".
- After the Lord's resurrection, Thomas refused to believe except after he sees the print of the nails in His hands and the spear in His side.
- 8 days after His resurrection, and on "Thomas Sunday", the Lord appeared to Thomas and made Thomas see His hands and His side so he believed.
- Then Jesus said to us, all the Christian believers, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (John 20:29)

Bible Verse

"For we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7)



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Passage Reading Genesis 22



LESSON CONCEPT:

Obedience to my father gives me life.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Abraham & Sarah got a baby "Isaac" when Abraham was 100 years old.
- Abraham prepares to sacrifice Isaac.
- God kept his promise.

- What did God tell Abraham to do with his son, Isaac?
- What happened when Abraham was just about to kill Isaac?
- God did not really want Abraham to kill his son. Why did he ask Abraham to do it?





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ISAAC

Passage Reading Genesis 22

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Sometimes we have to sacrifice or give up things to serve God better.
- Abraham obeyed God and so should we.
- Trust God even if we don't understand what He is going to do.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- We have all learned to obey God and also to obey our Church.
- Sometimes, we do not understand clearly the benefit of a certain spiritual practice, like 'fasting' for example.
- We have to trust that obeying our spiritual mother, the Church, will give us life: 'Spiritual Life'.

Bible Verse

"Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right" (Ephesians 6:1)



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
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JACOB

Passage Reading Genesis 27

LESSON CONCEPT:

The value of blessing in life.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Isaac & Rebekah had twins Esau & Jacob
- Esau was the oldest so he had the birth right.
- Esau sold his birthright to his brother irrationally.
- Jacob extracted the blessing from Esau.

- Who were Isaac and Rebekah's sons?
- How were Esau & Jacob different?
- What was the thing that Esau traded his birthright for?
- How did Rebekah & Jacob trick Isaac to give the blessing to Jacob
- What did Esau want to do to Jacob?







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JACOB

Passage Reading Genesis 27

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Deception is wrong and leads to hurt and anger.
- God works his plans through all kinds of people.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Every time we go to pray the Liturgy at church, Abouna would bless everyone before leaving.
- He says: "The love of God the Father and the grace of the only begotten Son, our Lord, God and Saviour Jesus Christ, and the fellowship and the gift of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Go in peace. The Lord be with you all. Amen".

"The blessing of the Lord makes one rich, and He adds no sorrow with it" (Proverbs 10:22)

LESSON CONCEPT:

LIFE APPLICATION:

- We should love and appreciate our siblings and try to live in peace with them.
- Jealousy can lead to anger and hatred.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Most of our Church Martyrs were treated so violently and with clear hatred. However, as Christians, Martyrs were very loving, forgiving and even we read about many of them that they were praying to their persecutors.
- Finally, because they lived and died loving God, He also rewarded them richly in the heavens, and according to our Church we believe that they have all received what we call 'the crown of martyrdom'.
- Holy Spirit be with you all. Go in peace. The Lord be with you all. Amen".




LESSON CONCEPT:

LIFE APPLICATION:


- To have faith that God's powerful hand is always there to save His children.

LESSON CONCEPT:


God's Commandments Enlightened My way.

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How can we live with God's commandments?


LESSON CONCEPT:

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How do we react in the times of stress?


LESSON CONCEPT:



Passage Reading Joshua 3&4




LESSON CONCEPT:

As the son/daughter of God, I am under His protection

LESSON SUMMARY:

- After forty years of wandering in the desert, it was time to cross over the Jordan River and take the land that God had promised.
- Joshua told the priests to carry the Ark of the Covenant and begin walking into the Jordan.
- The river immediately stopped flowing. And the people started to walk through to the other side.
- To help the Israelites remember all that He had done for them, the Lord had them pile twelve large stones from the middle of the Jordan.

- Which river did the Israelites have to cross to enter the Promised Land? +Jordan River
- What did the Priests carry when they crossed the Jordan River? +The Ark of the Covenant
- What happened to the rushing water of the Jordan when the priests stepped into it? +It stopped
- What did the Israelites pick up from the middle of the Jordan River? +12 stones
- Why did the Lord tell Joshua to have the men pile the twelve stones together? +So they would see it and remember what the Lord had done for them.

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How can we sanctify ourselves? What does the river Jordan represent in our lives?


LESSON CONCEPT:


 When facing any challenges in our lives, first step to do is praying, and see how God can conquer all our challenges.


LESSON CONCEPT:

- The battle lasted a long time because the Lord caused the sun to stand still.
- Joshua should have inquired of the Lord in the first place.




LESSON CONCEPT:


 When you get into the church and look to the east, you will find Jesus on the cross on top of the iconostasis. You will immediately notice that when Jesus was crucified, He had both His arms widely open, because He is accepting everyone repenting and returning to Him.

PRAYING

Passage Reading Acts 3:1-10

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Let the children talk about real life situations where God responded in different ways (Yes / Postponed Yes / No) to their prayers.
- Ask the children to help anyone one in need. At least we can help by praying for them.
- Even very young children can be taught the rudiments of prayer, such as bowing their heads, closing their eyes and speaking to God in simple phrases. As children grow, they can learn to pray more and more in accord with the big, overarching themes of the Bible.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Moses fasted and prayed for 40 days on the mount of Sinai to receive the 10 commandments, the word of God. We also fast and pray for 43 days before Christmas to receive Jesus Christ the Word of God in our hearts. But why do we fast for 3 more days than Moses did?
- This is because our Church believes that the toughest problems can be resolved by prayers.
- Lest we forget this, the Church fathers picked one of the most remarkable events when the Mount of Mokattam was moved after all the congregation have fasted and prayed for 3 days. They added those 3 days to the 40 days to form the Advent (Christmas fasting).



- Yet they insisted on testifying to the Lord and never denied Him or their faith; and that's why they are heavenly rewarded and we venerate them.



- What will happen on earth (explain quickly what will happen when the first 6 seals will be opened in chapter 6 - show connection to the heavenly scene revealed in the old testament to Ezekiel 1, and the seals to Matthew 24, the future tribulation period), if time permits.

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

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Where can we get an idea about heaven? (church)
- What do we know about the glory of the Saints who conquered evil and went to heaven? Have you heard about the apparitions of St Mary around the world?
- Compare how far do I get upset if I commit a sin versus when I lose some electronic device that I like playing with.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Every time we attend a liturgy, we go into a quick trip to heaven.
- We know that the Church is called the "house of Angels". Through the liturgy we chant "Through the intercessions of the Theotokos St Mary...", then "The Cherubim worship You, ...", then after the commemoration of the Saints we chant "May their holy blessing be with us. Amen. ...".
- In short, for the whole time of the liturgy we focus our minds that we are present in heaven with the angels and the saints and in front of the throne of God.

Bible Verse

"Blessed and holy is the one who shares in the first resurrection! Over such the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ, and they will reign with him for a thousand years." (Revelation 20:6)
