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

LESSON CONCEPT:

I grow in knowing God by knowing His creation's master pieces

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God creates both earth and heaven and all forms of life in six days.
- The creation acts of each day are described.
- God creates man, both male and female, in His own image.
- Man is given dominion over all things and is commanded to multiply and fill the earth.

- What do you think is God's purpose of creation?
- Describe the meaning behind spiritual likeness in God's "image"?
- What are the characteristics of Man and woman?
- Which book our story comes from?



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CREATION

Genesis 1:1-31

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Praise the lord when I see all his wonderful creations
- Understand my role in this world as God's image.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

• In the liturgy of St Gregory, Abouna prays: "Because of the multitude of Your compassions, You formed me when I had no being. You set up the sky for me as a ceiling. You made the earth firm for me so that I could walk on it...". The Church reminds me of God's wonderful creation in the liturgy, this makes me always thankful to my Lord who cared for every little detail so that I live happily. He is truly "the Lover of mankind".

Bible Verse

"The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament shows His handiwork. Day unto day utters speech, and night unto night reveals knowledge. LESSON CONCEPT:

God has a solution to all my weaknesses

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The serpent (Lucifer) deceives Eve
- She and then Adam partake of the forbidden fruit.
- Her Seed (Christ) will bruise the serpent's head.
- The roles of woman and of man are explained.
- Adam and Eve are cast out of the Garden.

- Discussion Questions:
- What are Adam's and Eve's weaknesses?
- What are our challenges (weaknesses)?
- How does God help us through our challenges (weaknesses)?
- How do we communicate with God?
- How did she feel when she ate from the tree?

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Who are the serpents in our lives?
- What tempts us the most?
- Are we willing to give up things we love to obey God?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The Church, full of heavenly wisdom, teaches us not only to abstain from doing evil, but also to stop thinking of it. Actually, Eve fell into sin after she accepted to get into a discussion with Satan (through the serpent).
- love and trust. He/She can also spiritually guide me.

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How can we have a heart like Noah?

"For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55:9)



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

A time of godly men presiding over the growing family. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph, successive generations of the same family, ruled over the Hebrew people in the earliest days of their existence.

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ABRAHAM

Genesis 17, 18



LESSON CONCEPT:

- I am consecrated to God through Baptism (Circumcision was a symbol for Baptism)
- Hosting strangers is a huge blessing

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Circumcision becomes a token of the everlasting covenant between God and Abraham.
- Abraham will command his children to be just.
- The Lord appears to him

- What is a covenant?
- What is the covenant between Abraham and God?
- What is God's Covenant with us?
- What was God's goal when he established the covenant with Abraham?
- What did God reveal to Abraham about Sodom and what was Abraham's reaction?



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ABRAHAM

Genesis 17, 18

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Why is baptism important?
- Do I keep my covenant with God?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

 Baptism is the way to join Church. That's why the Baptism room is located at the entrance of the Church and must have 2 doors. An outer door for those who come in and a second door that opens into Church. A non-Christian person gets in for the Baptism room from its outer door, gets baptized, then continues into Church from the inner door.

Bible Verse

"For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:26-28)



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Genesis 22



LESSON CONCEPT:

The True Life (i.e. remaining faithful and obedient to God) has a price

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God orders Abraham to take Isaac and offer him as burnt offering.
- Abraham obeys as well as Isaac.
- Isaac is a symbol of Jesus.

- What did God ask Abraham to do?
- Why did God call Isaac (your beloved son)?
- How is Isaac a symbol of Jesus?
- Abraham received Isaac back alive, connect this to Jesus resurrection
- Abraham's faith was tested and he obeyed ... how was he rewarded (called righteous and friend of God)
- When is this passage read in church?



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ISAAC

Genesis 22

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Who do we obey without questions?
- Do we trust God's plan for our lives?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

 On every Covenant Thursday, the Church recalls the events of this story. Isaac was a symbol to our Lord Jesus Christ. From the fraction prayer of this day: "... As Isaac carried the firewood for the burnt offering, likewise Christ carried the wood of the Cross. And, as Isaac returned alive, likewise Christ rose from the dead ..."

Bible Verse

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)



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
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JACOB

Genesis 31, 32



LESSON CONCEPT:

Persistence and perseverance are essential to get the blessings.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The Lord commands Jacob to return to Canaan.
- Laban pursues him; they resolve their differences and make a covenant of peace.
- Jacob sees angels. He asks God to preserve him from Esau, for whom he prepares presents.
- He wrestles all night with God.
- Jacob's name is changed to Israel.
- He sees God face to face.

- What did God tell Jacob to do?
- What did Jacob pray to God about?
- Why did Jacob wrestle with God?
- What does Israel stand for?
- Which book did our story come from?



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JACOB

LIFE APPLICATION:

- What is my source of comfort? Talking to a friend or playing games?
- What about talking with my best and closest friend, Jesus?
- Make sure to talk to Him every night (through prayers and reading the Bible) and ask Him to give you guidance and comfort..

CHURCH CONCEPT:

 On many occasions, the Church has a night of prayers and praises. My participation is a sign of love for God and a way to receive many spiritual blessings.

Bible Verse

"I will not let You go unless You bless me!" (Genesis 32:26)



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JOSEPH

Genesis 39 to 41



LESSON CONCEPT:

The life of Holiness and Victory

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Joseph, prospered by the Lord and becomes ruler of Potiphar's house.
- He resists the advances of Potiphar's wife, is falsely accused, and is cast to prison. The keeper of the prison commits the prison's affairs into Joseph's hands. Joseph interprets Pharaoh's dreams as seven years of plenty and seven of famine.
- He proposes a grain storage program. Pharaoh appoints him ruler over all Egypt

- Joseph interpretations of the Dreams
- When did the Butler remember Joseph? Is there good timing for everything?
- How did Joseph interpret Pharaoh's dreams?
- Did Joseph deserve to be the ruler of Egypt because he only interpreted the dream?





- Is God not in control when you face unfairness in life?


CHURCH CONCEPT:


LESSON CONCEPT:

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How can we live with God's commandments?

LESSON CONCEPT:


Submission and thanksgiving make me closer to God (unlike rebellion and discontent)

LIFE APPLICATION:


- How do we react in the times of stress?

God keeps us alive with His own ways


LESSON SUMMARY:




LESSON CONCEPT:

- Try to remember one incident where God's hands were carrying you.


CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The army of Judas was too small compared to the army of Seron. So the companions of Judas asked him how could they win the war with such a big army and also, they have been weakened by fasting.
- Judas encouraged his men by saying "For victory in warfare is not in the multitude of the army, but in the strength from heaven."
- Judas and his army attacked the Syrians and crushed them.
 They killed 800 of them and the rest of the Syrian army was dispersed.

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HEAVENLY REWARDS TO THOSE WHO CONQUER

Revelation 3:1-6

LIFE APPLICATION:

- What are our Heavenly rewards according to the Bible?
- How can we stay focused on our eternal life in Heaven with Jesus?
- Is being a Christian just enough for receiving Heavenly rewards?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The sign of life in our Church is to serve, and to do good. Therefore a healthy living congregation (spiritually) consists of members who are all involved in specific services.
- There is always a service suitable for everyone, of any age group.

Bible Verse

"He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels." (Revelation 3:5)



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REVEALING THINGS TO COME

Revelation 15, 16, 17, 18, 19



LESSON CONCEPT:

While God is revealing to the righteous the glorious place prepared for them; He is also revealing to the unrighteous how unpleasant will be their ending if they continue in their impurity and persist to enjoy living in the city of evil.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The 7 Bowls of God's wrath (the Last plagues).
- Read (Chapter 15), highlighting the glorious place and explain contents and the praise of victorious people with the song of Moses.
- Then explain briefly the symbolism of those 7 plagues in Ch. 16
- Then, brief as a story the falling of BABYLON the Great, the Scarlet Woman And the Scarlet Beast (symbolism and how each of them was ended) Ch. 17, 18.
- Finally, highlight the victory of the heaven and the 5 reasons for praising Him saying "Alleluia" Ch. 19:
- 1- For delivering His people from their enemies(v.1)
- 2- For maintaining His Justice (v.2)
- 3- For His permanent control over evil (v.3)
- 4- For His Sovereignty (v.6)
- 5- For His communion with His people (v.7)



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REVEALING THINGS TO COME

Revelation 15, 16, 17, 18, 19

LIFE APPLICATION:

- God is Just
- There is a judgment day
- Where do you want to stand that day?
- How glorious and rewarding is that day for those who love God and follow his commandments.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- We believe that all Saints who conquered evil in their earthly life are now in a glorious place in heaven.
- One way our Church symbolizes the Saints victory is by having a procession on their departure days.
- Note that this procession is always rotating counterclockwise inside the Church. Meaning this Saint was able to resist the world and conquered evil (since time represents the world).
- The only person that has a reversed procession (clockwise) is Judas the Iscariot, because he was conquered by the world and by evil.

Bible Verse

"Great and marvelous are Your works, Lord God Almighty! Just and true are Your ways, O King of the saints! Who shall not fear You, O Lord, and glorify Your name? For You alone are holy. For all nations shall come and worship before You, for Your judgments have been manifested." (Revelation 15:3-4)



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HEAVENLY JERUSALEM

Revelation 22



LESSON CONCEPT:

Discovering to what extent God loves us as His children, that he revealed to us some important details about what to come and about the place he prepared for us to live forever with Him. Thus we strive for staying always with Him and long for His second coming with all the Church.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The Heavenly Glorious State (Revelation 22)
- The river of life (v.1-4)
- Jesus referred to it in John 4:13 as (water of life)
- The time is near/purify yourself more (v.6-11)
- Rewards to faithful people and those who are thirsty to His coming/ He testifies in the churches (v.12-17)
- Very Important warning regarding His words (v.18,19)
- He promised to come quickly (v.20)

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HEAVENLY JERUSALEM

Revelation 22

LIFE APPLICATION:

- What is the purpose of our lives on earth?
- Where are we going after?
- How glorious is eternal life with Jesus?
- What is the glory awaiting us with Jesus in Heavenly Jerusalem?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- As the goal of our life on earth is to reach heaven, our Church prepared a very special program for the vigil of the Apocalypse.
- After Jesus Christ was crucified, He went to Hades and opened the gates of paradise to all the Saints of the old testament.
- That's why part of the Apocalypse program is to read the complete book of Revelation, because it describes how beautiful is Heaven and how glorious is our Lord Jesus Christ who completed our salvation on the Cross.

Bible Verse

"And the Spirit and the bride say, "Come!" And let him who hears say, "Come!" And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely." (Revelation 22:17)
